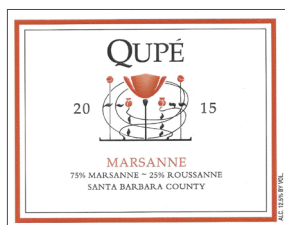

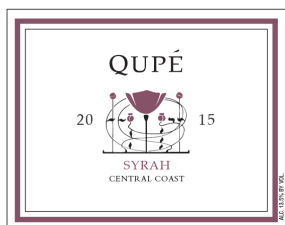

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### 2015 Marsanne

This wine is 75% Marsanne from the Los Olivos District, 25% Roussanne from the Santa Maria Valley and Los Olivos District. This shows dried apple, light melon, sweet chamomile and tangy lime juice on the nose. Racy acidity and tactile tension show on the palate, with light stone fruit and citrus flavors.



### 2015 Central Coast Syrah

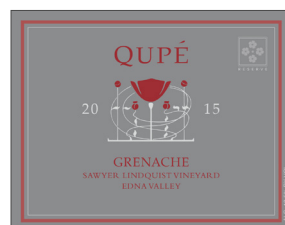
A blend of several cool and warm climate sites across San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara Counties, this wine exhibits spice and racy mineral aspects with balanced red fruit and lengthy freshness on the palate.



### 2015 "Y Block" Chardonnay

#### 91 Points - Anthony Dais Blue

This wine comes primarily from the Y Block at Bien Nacido Vineyard in the Santa Maria Valley area of northern Santa Barbara County. Rounding out the blend are small amounts of Viognier, Roussanne and Marsanne. This is very traditionally styled Chardonnay, fresh, crisp, with minerals, citrus and a nice touch of oak.



### 2015 Grenache

This wine is 90% Grenache and 10% Syrah from the Sawyer Lindquist Vineyard in the Edna Valley. We planted this vineyard in 2005, using biodynamic farming methods, and in 2009 it was Demeter Certified Biodynamic. This cool climate Grenache differs in character from its warm, Southern Rhône counterparts – it is very elegant, with a purity of fruit and brilliant cherry red clarity.
